Rich's Ramblin's Rich Carroll

Once a battery manufacturer, always a ...???

Just when you start to believe that there is some stability in the manufacture of automotive traction batteries, it seems many suppliers have some significant problems, and are reported to be belly up. But that doesn't mean the end of production for that company.

Samsung was making lithium ion batteries, but seemed poised to go out of that part of the business to focus on more electronic intensive business. Now we hear that Samsung SDI is talking to Tesla (who currently uses Panasonic as a battery supplier.) Samsung wants to produce batteries for Tesla.

Another South Korean company, LG Chem is also bidding with Tesla, only a few months after also being reportedly at the end of lithium production. Perhaps these rumors were simply that, and perhaps even started by the manufacturer themselves to keep their current prospects and negotiations more secretive.

And we all heard of A123 Systems, who filed for bankruptcy in October 2012. A123 stopped production, and announced they could not pay their bills. (and couldn't repay their government loans) The Wanxiang Group purchased significant portions of the A123 assets (at least a significant portion of the non-military assets). (The military portions of the A123 assets were sold to Navitas.) Now, A123 Systems appears poised to make a comeback. The A123 company is managed tightly by Wanxiang America, whose headquarters is in Elgin, IL.

A123 Systems has pieces of the company in many US locations; their batteries are made in Romulus and Livonia, both suburbs of the now bankrupt city of Detroit. A123 grid systems are integrated and managed from Westborough, MA, and their R&D department is in the Boston area. A123 is working on their Nanophosphate EXT (EXtreme Temperature) batteries that can operate at extreme ranges of temperatures without a need for thermal management.

Other battery news is just as interesting:

Ford is building a new \$8 million research lab, in conjunction with the University of Michigan. (Remember U. of M, they are part of the new J-CESR battery research project at Argonne National Labs.)


Lawrence Berkeley National Labs have announced that they are working on a sulfur-graphene-oxide as a battery component. You will likely remember that they too, are part of J-CESR.

Volvo is fairly well along with a combination of multiple layers of carbon fibre, each layer insulated from the next by a thin fiberglass panel. The layers are polymer infused carbon fibre, which act as the anode and cathode in the system. Engineers from Volvo have replaced several steel body panels with this carbon fibre battery sandwich. Essentially the hood, trunk lid and doors are all batteries.

This keeps being very interesting, but soon you are going to need a scorecard to keep track of the players.



Presentations:

Tom Brunka came back to visit us and tell us more about his vision for a BMS free Li-lon battery pack. He believes the BMS is a carry over from the Lead Acid EV days, described how a shunt regulator in a BMS could actually cause a fire, feels it could save some money and a voltage over range would be slight.

The second presenter was **Kevin Stutenberg**, Assoc. Vehicle Test Engineer, Argonne National Lab, and his presentation was titled, "Advanced Powertrain Research Facility (Argonne): Testing and Analysis of Electrified Vehicles." He presentation included an overview on vehicle instrumentation, electric improvements in powertrain efficiency, electric standards and results in recent testing. He's been with Argonne and testing advanced vehicles for the last 18 months, including natural gas, hybrids, diesel turbo charged cars, hydrogen fuel cell vehicles and the X prize. He provided a wealth of details on specific EV testing and their process at Argonne.
