

#### Ceremony

#### Presentation

Tim Goebel from Commute Connect presented and demonstrated his On Balance Outdoor Self Balancing Unicycle (SBU) and Solo Wheel. At the break several members tested them out!

After the break a Presentation on How to electrify a 1930 Hupmobile steel street rod was given by Bruce Jones. The first half of the presentation was on making the car roadworthy.

Ideas were presented and discussed on how to proceed and whether to make a 100% electric or create a hybrid. A vote was informally taken in favor of electric.

Then meeting ended at 9:20 p.m.

Rich's Ramblings Rich Carroll

Some surprises exist on the list of electric vehicles produced in the USA, and perhaps it isn't completely who you thought. You likely guessed that the number one producer was Nissan, as they made 30,200 Leafs during 2014, mostly in Smyrna, TN. After that, who is next in production numbers for American produced plug in EV's? I started to write this ramblings, thinking that Roush Industries who makes the Low Speed Electric Vehicles for the autonomous Google city bound 'Google Maps' cars would be on the list. They have made well over a hundred cars for Google in the Roush facility in Allen Park, a suburb of Detroit. Rouse didn't even make the list as I had to narrow the list to exclude LSEV's otherwise the list would be inappropriately long.

Tesla produced about 33,000 or 35,000 cars in it's Fremont, CA factory. With similar production numbers is the Plug in Prius, but that isn't made in the US.

The next biggest production is in Hamtramck. Hamtramck (and it's neighbor Highland Park) is an enclave in the city of Detroit. It is a very distinct, ethnic oriented city with a size of about two square miles and around 22,000 people. The biggest employer in Hamtramck is GM with it's Detroit/Hamtramck assembly line where the Volt is manufactured under the Chevrolet Volt name along with exports called the Holden Volt, The Opel Ampera, and the Vauxhall Ampera. Sales numbers for our comparison year of 2014 are difficult to isolate, but appear to be about 20,000 units.

After those players, the numbers get real fuzzy. Also made in the USA:

- The Cadillac ELR is made with the Volt. Only 1,316 units sold in the US Market in 2014.
- The Ford Focus Electric, and the C-Max Energi plug in hybrid are made in Wayne, Michigan on the same production line as other Ford Focus models. Reportedly about 4000 Ford Focus Electrics were produced. Reportedly the C-Max Energy has sold over 16,000 units in the US between October 2012 and October 2014.
- The Ford Fusion Energi has extremely similar sales numbers to the C-Max Energi, and is also made in Wayne.
- Toyota RAV4EV's are built in Woodstock, Ontario, Canada, about midway between Detroit and Toronto, although the batteries and drive trains are built by Tesla at their Fremont, CA factory.

I was left asking the question of what else is there, what is assembled outside the USA. Here is a list of almost 50 cars that are available for purchase that are electric powered. <a href="https://goo.gl/yzYXdv">https://goo.gl/yzYXdv</a>

Looking at cars in pre-production and testing produces a list of 13 more cars. <a href="https://goo.gl/Ve0J5v">https://goo.gl/Ve0J5v</a> And just below that list is another ~15 cars that are about to go into production.

Do you have much of a choice about an EV? You most certainly do.
