Charitable Status

One of the things that we as an organization have thought about from time to time is whether we could apply to be a charitable organization from a legal and tax standpoint. Today the FVEAA is a not for profit organization established in the state of Illinois. We are not a 501c3 charitable organization. But several years ago we looked at what it would take to become a 501c3 charitable organization and one thing we struggled with was the fact that some of the officers/ board members had companies or were employed by Electric Vehicle related companies. That brought up questions on whether there were conflicts of interest with the requirements to become a 501c3. It was the topic of several board meetings and discussions and the pursuit of charitable status was eventually dropped.

The individuals who currently comprise the officers and board however are not employed by EV companies, so we are again looking at the possibility of applying for 501c3 status. We'll keep everyone informed as this is pursued further over in the months ahead. If anyone would like to assist with the paperwork process please let me know!

Charged Magazine, a.k.a Charged EV

The paper magazine business has literally been in free fall for many years, as the immediacy and brevity of online articles takes precidence. I subscribe to several paper car magazines, although as I adapt to living on a fixed income, I tried to reduce my magazine costs, and thought I would simply not renew a couple that I did not read cover to cover. Examples of the magazines I do subscribe to are <u>Car and Driver</u>, <u>Road & Track</u>, and

Automobile. I had been paying about \$15 to \$20 a year for each, and considered them a great value. They are great reading in bed, trying to settle in, and most of the articles are reasonably short, making them great reads in the smallest room in the house.

When I didn't renew, along came offers of \$12 a year, then \$10 a year, and all got to an offer of \$8 a year before giving up. A couple went to \$5 a year. Has the quality changed? Not at all. Has the number of pages diminished? No. Number of ads up? No, again. It is obvious that the paper magazines are in deep trouble. The cost of printing an issue and mailing it each month is excessive, perhaps one the advertising cannot sustain.



There is one paper magazine that lands on my desk, free of charge for those in the industry, that has been consistently expanding, continually presenting really good information, regularly being at the forefront of new issues. It looks like it is called <u>Charged</u>, although I think the real name is <u>Charged EVs</u>, or <u>Charged Electric Vehicles Magazine</u>.

Lately in each and every issue there are ten or fifteen full length, interesting articles. <u>Charged EVs</u> falls into the trade magazine classification. If you are in the industry, and virtually everyone in FVEAA is included, you can be on their complimentary subscription list. But it gets even better.

Start at https://chargedevs.com/ and note that at the top of the web page is an area called "Daily Newswire" with topics updated regularly. New announcements and developments are catagorized for you into The Vehicles, The Tech, and The Infrastructure. Scroll down, and you will find a digital copy of the recent print magazine, completely readable on line. Below the magazine are the features listed in categories. I would urge you adopt this as a wonderful, free resource, to stay updated with EV news. OK, my secret is out, for next month, I have to find a new source of ideas for a column.
